DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION: NOVEMBER 22, 2024 Winners will be Awarded Prizes on November 30, 2024

RULES AND CRITERIA:

Winners: A panel of impartial judges will award one Winner in each category.

Category of Winners: Grades $3^{\text{rd}-5}^{\text{th}}$ \$350 Grades 6^{th} - 8^{th} \$750 Grades 9^{th} - 12^{th} \$1,500

Eligibility: The Competition is open to youth throughout Alabama for grades 3 through 12.

Contestants must provide the judges with a copy of the typewritten composition that includes material reference. In addition to a written copy of the Essay, you may as an option, submit a video of you delivering your Essay and permission to be shown to judges virtually. You will be judged by the following criteria:

Length of Essay: Grades 3rd - 5th 300 words

Grades 6th - 8th 500 words Grades 9th -12th 1,000+ words

Organization & Structure - Provide an original composition essay written by the contestant and keeping within the theme. The essay should be organized and well-structured with correct grammar and spelling.

Voice/Originality - The author should write in their personal style and approach to the topic from his/her unique perspective.

Evidence of Personal Reflection - The essay should demonstrate that the author has genuinely explored the topic and how it relates to his or her own life.

Language - Essays should be written in English and represent the youth's original work. Youth are welcome to write essays in their native language (if not English), but it must be translated into English for submission.

Reference - Use at least one outside source; provide the judges with a copy of the composition that includes the references or resources used for your essay.
